Wanted visiting Consultant Gynecologist for ARTH Health Centres

Action Research & Training for Health (ARTH) is a 24 year old non-profit organization based in Udaipur, serving the needs of low income communities in rural Udaipur and Rajsamand districts and in Udaipur city. Senior doctors and medical college faculty are members of its Governing Board. The organization provides reproductive health, neonatal and child health services and provides care for the elderly. It carries out training of doctors, nurses and health workers, and has conducted research on various RH areas.

ARTH provides services through well equipped rural health centres located at Iswal and Paneriyon ki Bhagal (district Udaipur) and Lakhmavaton ka Guda (district Rajsamand) and Mulla Talai in Udaipur city. Each clinic is staffed by well trained locally resident nurse-midwives.

1. We are in need of a consultant obstetrician – gynecologist to provide outpatient services at our rural clinics on two days a week, and at the urban clinic for half day a week. The organization will provide a vehicle for travel to field areas. The terms and conditions are as follows:
2. The clinics offer a rural, primary care setting, the consultant is expected to see patients (~90% reproductive health needs) and provide care, a list of drugs is available at nominal cost at the clinic.
3. The clinics take all Covid-19 precautions including screening of patients on arrival, avoidance of crowding, use of masks, sanitizers and disinfection of surfaces and equipment. Clinic staff members have been vaccinated. Clinics are airy and well ventilated.
4. Patients needing further investigations, admission or surgery are provided escorted referral by ARTH staff to Government Zanana Hospital, Udaipur. A few designated private laboratories have been empanelled for investigations at discounted prices.
5. The consultant is expected to depart by 9.15 am and reach the rural clinics by 10.00 to 10.30 am (depending on distance from city) and remain in the clinic till 4 pm, returning by 5.00 to 5.30 pm. For the urban clinic, the consultant is expected to remain for minimum 4 hours.
6. Staff nurse-midwives attend to 80-100 deliveries per month on their own. Of which 6-8% require referral for complications. The consultant is expected to see patients referred at the time of clinic visit and also to be available for telephonic consultation regarding obstetric referrals.

An honorarium will be provided for each visit, as per organization's guidelines.
